TERRIFIC COLD KILLS MANY... Ephrates Valley Swept by Most Terrific Storm Ever Known There... LOSS OF LIFE REPORTED GREAT... Snow Continues for Sixty Consecutive Days and Nights, Reaching Depth of Nineteen Feet, Causing Big Property Loss... NEW YORK, April 9—(Special Telegram)—The men of the desert, in the Ephrates valley have been decimated, and their property to the extent of \$4,000,000 has been destroyed by snowstorms and cold, such as have never been experienced in that section within the memory of man... The story of devastation and the fearful suffering is told most graphically in a letter just received by Homer Davernport from one of the desert sheiks, and sent from Aleppo. He says: "Yes, it is with deep regret that we inform you that the condition of the Arabs now is deplorable... The snow and fatal cold came upon them unawares... Communication was cut off, the roads were stopped, the railroads, too, and many of the Arabs with their families died of privation without anyone knowing of their plight... The losses of live stock have been estimated at 300,000,000 pounds—300,000,000... Commerce is crippled and merchants are ruined...
