RAILWAY MAIL CLERK IN CHARGE

Regular Carriers Will Serve This District in the Future—Unthank Goes to the Main Office.

After May 1 the branch postoffice at the Union Pacific depot will be discontinued and the greater part of the mail work that has been done there will hereafter be performed at the central post office.

J. J. Hess, chairman of the republican county central committee, has decided that it will be necessary to mail notices to all of the delegates to the county convention elected at the June primaries last year.

KENYON DRAFTS TRUST BILL:

New Iowa Senator Ready with Sherman Law Changes.

WILL AWAIT TRUST DECISIONS

WASHINGTON, April 29.—(Special Telegram)—Senator W. B. Kenyon of Iowa, who introduced a bill for the modification of the Sherman anti-trust law, Senator Kenyon is engaged in drafting it, but has not announced the terms of the measure. It is his intention to seek to make the law more specific and more stringent than at present.

Senator Kenyon will probably defer the introduction of this bill until the supreme court has handed down the tobacco and oil decisions. He expects, however, that these will not be long delayed.

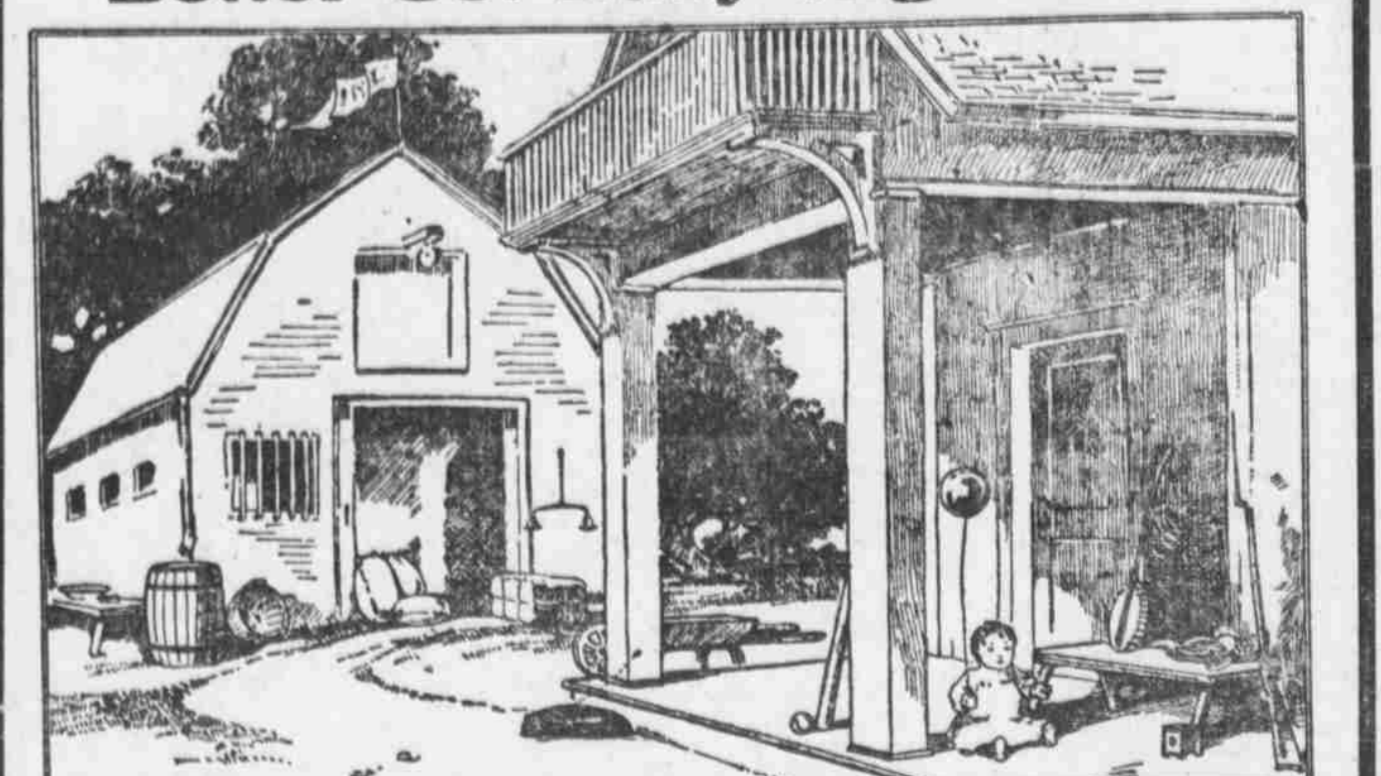
