Sentiment in Wheat Favors Bulls

Without Opposition.

DROUGHT TALK IS REVIVED

Idea Seems to Prevail that the Country

Has Not Had Sufficient

Moisture—Shorts Force

Prices Up.

OMAHA, May 11, 1911. Sentiment in wheat strongly favored the bull side and there was very little opposition.

Foreign advices were bullish and cables came sharply higher. The idea prevails that the country on the whole has not had sufficient moisture and as crop acres are in order, shorts overlooked rains in the interior and forced prices higher by bidding the market.

The corn market showed every indication of being overdone and the offerings were very small, prices advanced along with wheat. Light receipts gave a corn a strong tone and advanced the futures.

Wheat opened strong and advanced sharply with higher cables and bullish advices on crops started shorts to covering. Cash values were advanced with wheat advanced with wheat rising steadily higher on light supplies. Cash corn was higher.
