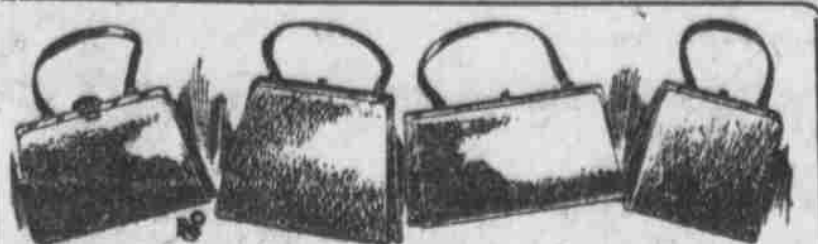

PRINCE OR CHAUFFEUR, by Lawrence Sanders; 283 pp.; \$1.50; Houghton Mifflin company.

This is a story of Newport. A Russian prince who is being entertained by the wife of a multi-millionaire takes opportunity as her guest to steal the secret of a torpedo that is being tested at the torpedo station. Suspecting the thief, Lieutenant Armitage, whose invention the torpedo is, disguises himself and becomes chauffeur in the millionaire's family in order to hunt the thief down. The rich man's daughter has an important place in the development of the story, which is quite as good as the opening premise.

JACK BALLINGTON ROBERTER, by John Trotwood Moore; 341 pp.; \$1.50; The John C. Winston company.

The story concerns the fortune of Jack Ballington, who, on account of his apparent lack of fighting qualities, seems to be in danger of losing both his material heritage and the girl he loves. But heroism will not be denied, and in the crisis he measures up to the traditions of his forefathers.

JESS OF HARBOR HILL, by Ramie A. Sheridan; 241 pp.; 50 cents; Cupples & Lee, N. Y.

Jess was a walf of a storm, picked up by an old lighthouse keeper who treated her as his own child. A young man who has been hurt in an automobile accident is brought to the lighthouse. He makes love to Jess and tries to solve the mystery of her identity. During a tremendous storm a young doctor, who has loved Jess since childhood, finds himself in great peril and Jess rescues him, and there the two find out they love each other.

THE DIVING PATHS, by L. L. Chappelle; 24 pp.; \$1.50; Broadway Publishing company.

A story of southern life, showing conditions in the early days. The book shows the struggle between duty and inclination, but in the end all are reunited.

THE PATH OF GLORY, by Paul Hawthorne; 241 pp.; \$1.50; Little, Brown & Co.

A fascinating romance of love and adventure in the time of the French and Indian war. Charles Randolph of Virginia

and Alfred de Saint Pierre, daughter of a French commandant, are the central figures. At the start Randolph incurs the enmity of Captain Teparati, a treacherous sailor for Alfred's hand, and throughout the book the two play a varying game of bitter contest.

THE VANITY BOX, by Alice Stuyvesant; 32 pp.; \$1.50; Doubleday, Page & Co.

An English lady of social prominence is found murdered at a lonely tower on her own estate. The last person to see her alive is her husband. The most important clue is a little gold vanity box which the murdered woman always carried, and the tale moves to a remarkable climax through a fog of misunderstanding and opposing forces.

FRANCE IN THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION, by James H. Parkes; 234 pp.; \$1.50; Houghton-Mifflin company.

This volume deals with the situation in France on the eve of the American revolution, with the first diplomatic relations of the two countries, with the important military aid furnished the Americans in the course of the war and with the paramount part played by France in the negotiations which finally resulted in the favorable treaty of peace.

THE EVOLUTION OF LITERATURE, by A. S. Mackenzie; 47 pp.; \$2.00; Thomas Y. Crowell & Co.

Prof. Mackenzie here gives a comprehensive survey of the process and progress of literature as a whole. The general reader as well as the specialist will enjoy exploring with him a realm whose riches are well-nigh inexhaustible— including researcher into the Australian mystery plays, Eskimo mythic tales, Zulu and Hindu fables, ancient Egyptian love songs and other unusual features that serve to illustrate literary evolution.

MEMORIES AND IMPRESSIONS, by Ford Madox Hueffer; 23 pp.; \$1.50; Harper & Bros.

Brought up among that strange group of pre-Raphaelites in which his grandfather, Ford Madox Brown, the painter, was a conspicuous figure, the author knew these men not as the world knows them, but in the intimate relations of their daily lives. The book is replete with anecdotes of this and later periods. The Rossettis, William Morris, Ruskin, Hunt, Frank Laszlo, Whistler and scores of others, all appear in these pages pictured by the

frank yet friendly hand of a writer who appreciated their foibles no less than their greatness.

THE ETHERAL EVANGEL, by Solomon T. Crowell; 27 pp.; \$1.50; Broadway Publishing company.

The author endeavors to help his readers to a better understanding and knowledge of God and His revelation.

THE MEDICAL EXPERT, by Louis J. Rosenberg; 5 pp.; 50 cents; Broadway Publishing company.

"The little volume contains three essays, 'The Medical Expert,' 'Professional Secrecy' and 'The Metabolism of Morality.'"

RIDDLES OF PREHISTORIC TIMES, by James H. Anderson; 37 pp.; \$1.50; Broadway Publishing company.

The author gives us the earliest traditions concerning the evolution of the world from chaos to existing order.

THE DISINTEGRATING CHURCH, by Frederick William Aikin; 75 pp.; Broadway Publishing company.

The status of the church today, presented by one who speaks from knowledge of both inside and outside.

WHAT IS THE UNIVERSE? by F. B.

Marcus; 16 pp.; 75 cents; Funk & Wagnalls company.

This little volume is written with the object of stimulating men and women to think and in answer to Prof. Haack's book, "The Riddle of the Universe."

ADMINISTRATION OF THE COLLEGE CURRICULUM, by William T. Foster; 300 pp.; \$1.50; Houghton-Mifflin company.

The chief movement in the history of the college curriculum is the breakdown of prescribed programs through the evolution of the elective system. These studies merit consideration because they throw the light of history upon present problems and give suggestions based on the careful organization of facts.

THE PRACTICAL COUNTRY GENTLEMAN, by Edward K. Parkinson; 144 pp.; \$1.50; A. C. McClurg & Co.

The author gives practical and pertinent suggestions for the owner of a country estate, large or small. Water supply and pumps; the kind of stock to buy; crops, fertilizers, how to use them, and the wood lot; ways in which farm products may be marketed and cultivation of high-priced specialties are among the subjects discussed.

SATCHEL GUIDE TO EUROPE, by W.

J. Rolfe; 24 pp.; \$1.50; Houghton Mifflin company.

This is the fourth annual edition, and includes Great Britain, Belgium, Holland, Germany, Switzerland, France, Austria and Italy, and contains general information.

FARM DAIRYING, by Laura Rees; 206 pp.; \$1.50; C. McClurg & Co.

The dairy industry is presented in a simple and practical manner. Illustrated.

DANIEL WEBSTER: A VINDICATION, WITH OTHER HISTORICAL ESSAYS, by William Cleaver Wilkinson; 49 pp.; \$1.25; Funk & Wagnalls company.

Prof. Wilkinson's undertaking is to show that Webster is to be praised, not blamed, for his March 7 speech and for his support of the fugitive slave law. The other essays cover widely divergent and interesting historical topics.
