DENVER, May 14.—(Special Telegram)—Omaha secured a good lead in the early innings, principally through a home run by Kane and two errors by Coffey, but in the following innings a bad throw by Agnew gave the local team its start and the thing was finished by hard hitting.

Omaha tried three pitchers without being able to stop the hitting. Kneaves distinguished himself in the fifth with a marvelous stop of a ground ball that cramped a batting rally. Agnew caught first ball, his one error being a bad throw to first.

Anderson opened the game with a single and King followed with another, but was caught trying to make it good for two bases. Kane's home run to center scored two runs. In the second an error by Harris gave Schipke first, and two errors by Coffey permitted him to score. After that only one Omaha man got to third, and that was Pickering, who made a two-bagger in the fourth.

For Denver Weidenhau made a two-bagger in the third and Quinn was given first. Agnew tried to catch Quinn off first, throwing the ball a right field and letting both runners in. In the next inning Cassidy beat out a hunt, went to second on Harris' hit and scored on Lloyd's single. This sent Hill to the bench.
