

STELZLE MAKING PROGRESS

Presbyterian Evangelist to Labor Has Big Task Ahead.

HEAD OF "FORWARD" MOVEMENT

Social Workers of National Reputation Issue Important Document to Make Clear Their Plan to Help Church.

NEW YORK, May 27.—(Special to The Bee.)—One of the practical men of the church in New York is Rev. Charles Stielze, who has had charge of the labor department of the Presbyterian church and has done fine work in taking the church to the workmen who would not go to the church.

Rev. Mr. Stielze is now the social service secretary of the "men and religion forward movement" just launched by leading churches of the United States and which has designated Mr. M. Stielze the task of "surveying" ninety of the principal cities of the United States and Canada. In each of the cities there will be a local committee of 100 of the most prominent laymen to supervise the campaign. These studies will deal with religious and social conditions and work among men and boys. It is believed that this will be the most comprehensive study of its kind that has been attempted in the history of the American church. The result of these studies will serve as the basis of future plans for the national men's "brotherhoods" in the churches, the international committee of the Young Men's Christian association and the International Sunday School association.

A comprehensive schedule of subjects for investigation has been prepared by Rev. Mr. Stielze, which involves the co-operation with the churches of the municipal authorities and experts on housing and general health conditions, the social workers of each city interested in educational and recreational life, the workmen who are concerned about economic and industrial conditions, and the leaders in general educational and social improvement.

Outline of the Plan. In an important document addressed to the social service committees of the men and religion forward movement, and signed by social workers of national reputation, the following appears:

"We believe that the men and religion forward movement offers to the Christian men of America and unparalleled opportunity to express the growing social consciousness in the church. There has never been a time when the men in the great brotherhood and in the church at large have been so eager in the matter of social service. We believe that they are simply waiting to have someone direct them to a definite task.

"The fact that the leaders in the Men and Religion Forward Movement have given social service so prominent a place in the proposed campaign indicates that they are alert not only to the need of the work, but that they appreciate its importance in connection with a movement which is to touch the whole life of America's manhood. It also shows that those leaders have rightly interpreted 'social service' when they characterized it as 'social service' and 'religion.' Such an emphasis makes plain the fact that it is just as important for men to get right with men as that they get right with God. It is laying stress upon the second great commandment—'Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself,' which Jesus said was like unto the first—'Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, with all thy soul, and with all thy mind.'

Great Chance for Results.

"Because this movement has in it such a comprehensive appeal, we give it our hearty support. We bespeak for it the endorsement of all social workers who may hitherto have been indifferent to the church, because they have felt that the church has not been concerned about the burdens which have been crushing those unfortunate members of society to whose interest they devote their lives. We value this movement because it gives all the workers in the social field an opportunity to come face to face with one another and with the workers in the church. We believe that out of the conferences and discussions and mass meetings will come a greater appreciation of the needs of our common humanity; that the workman and the employer of labor will see each other's problems with clearer vision; that the practical service in attempting together to meet the pressing social questions of the day will make us understand that while we may not agree in nonessentials, nevertheless we have in common the desire to share the purpose of Jesus and to help bring in the kingdom of God."

ROYALTIES BEGIN TO ARRIVE

British Society Flutters Fitfully as Coronation Draws Near.

GOOD FOR FASHIONABLE DOCTORS

LONDON, May 27.—(Special to The Bee.)—As the day for the coronation grows closer, it absolutely absorbs social interest. Already the royalties and other high persons will represent their governments officially at the ceremonies having been so distinguished by every capital of Europe and many of those from the other grand divisions of the earth are represented unofficially by scores of their very best.

From now until the coronation has been concluded and long afterwards London will be gay as even the great metropolis never has been gay. Great social functions will crowd upon each other so fast that even the most industrious of the society folk will not be able to keep up with the pace and it may be freely predicted that the fashionable physicians will have their hands full in treating cases of nervous prostration.

Queen Mary Picks Carnations.

The pink carnation known as Lady Hermione is the flower selected for the coronation bouquet, which the queen has signified her willingness to accept from the gardeners' company. Lady Hermione is an English or border variety, and some hundreds of blooms are being especially grown by the various growers for this bouquet. The gardeners' company will select the choicest of these. The bouquet will be offered to her majesty in a very beautiful silver or silver-gilt basket of the gardeners' design of the basket represented in the crest of the gardeners' company.

The Queen's Fan.

One of the most charming items of Queen Mary's coronation trousseau will be her fan. The fan measures about twenty-two inches and will be entirely British. It is the center of the leaf that is a cartouche with the queen's cypher surmounted with the royal crown. On the field of the fan are the arms of England, Scotland, Ireland and the new arms of Wales. The most picturesque feature is the imperial touch supplied by the symbols of the four great over-sea dominions—India, Canada, Australia and South Africa.

To complete the design and to unite the imperial emblems to the mother country, the designer has included the rose, shamrock and thistle. The sticks are of yellow tortoise shell from India. They are decorated with the royal crown and the queen's cypher, and are exceptionally artistic in design. A gold pin with a diamond at each end holds the fan sticks together. A small white silk tassel completes what is really a masterpiece.

Royalty in Borrowed Chairs.

Great preparations are being made at St. Paul's in connection with the coronation visit of the king and queen. It is a site quite new that royal personages should be provided with gilded chairs on such an occasion. There has been some difficulty in discovering any suitable antique chairs for the purpose, but it is believed that Lord Guildford, who is the possessor of an antique set of gilded chairs, will be asked to lend a pair for the use of their majesties when they visit St. Paul's.

Prince Arthur as Handy Man.

The handy man of the royal family, as Prince Arthur of Connaught is called, is now ready for his job, having represented King George at the jubilee celebrations of Italian unity. He is a young man of

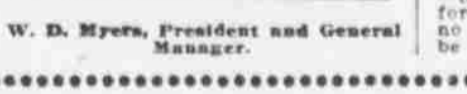

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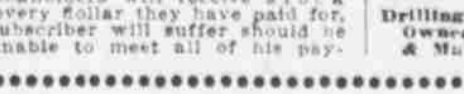
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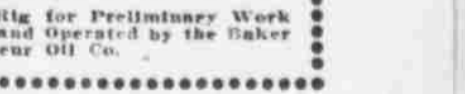
