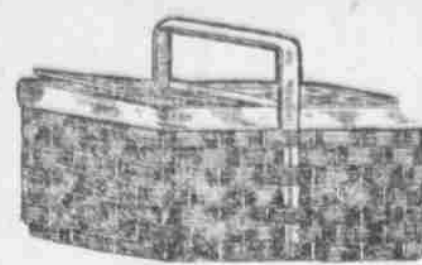

### PANTORIUM BULLETIN NO. 1.

#### When Dry Cleaning Does Not Clean

It is the usual practice now-a-days among the better class of Cleaners to put everything to be cleaned through the Dry Clean first, after which the garments are inspected and those containing stains and spots that cover too much space for the spotter to remove are put through the Wet Clean.

The reason badly soiled garments are first put through the gasoline is to remove the grease and dirt, which if done by steam cleaning would require hot water, soap and soda and much hard brushing which is hard on most goods; while after Dry Cleaning the remaining stains and spots can be removed with lake water, or cold water, and whatever chemical agents the stains require.

Some Cleaners prefer to save the time and expense of putting goods thru the Dry Clean, but not so here—quality being the first consideration, expense afterward.
