Lorimer Resolution Goes Over in Senate

Culberson Wants Time to Consider Appointment of Subcommittee to Conduct Inquiry.

WASHINGTON, June 6.—Carrying out the program agreed on yesterday by the senate committee on privileges and elections, Senator Dillingham today introduced in the senate a resolution authorizing the special committee of eight members of the regular elections committee to re-investigate the charges against Senator Lorimer of Illinois.

Senator Culberson objected to the immediate consideration of the resolution and it went over. Mr. Culberson said the document differed somewhat from the original resolution and he desired time to consider it.

The resolution names Senators Dillingham, Gamble, Jones, Kenyon, Johnson, Fletcher, Kern and Lea. They are directed forthwith to investigate whether in the election of William Brewster as a senator of the United States from the state of Illinois, there were used and employed corruptive methods and practices and whether he is now entitled to retain his seat.

The committee is authorized by the resolution to sit during the sessions of the senate and during any recess of the senate or of congress, to hold sessions at such place or places as it shall deem most convenient for the purpose of the investigation; to employ stenographers, counsel, accountants, and to send for persons, books, records and papers, to administer oaths, and as early as practicable to report to the senate the results of its investigation.

Long Leap Made by an Automobile

Car Runs Off Embankment at Cedar Rapids Without Injury to Itself or Five Occupants.

CEDAR FALLS, June 6.—One of the most peculiar automobile accidents happened in this city late Sunday afternoon when a five-passenger car went over an embankment of twenty feet and by actual measurement leaped forty-eight feet without overturning, landing in a bed of rock and mud without suffering any harm either to the car or any of its five passengers. The car belongs to Dr. J. Stevens and was being run by his son, Harry, aged 27 years. The car while running at great speed got beyond his control and as he sought to keep it from veering into the fence on the right hand side turned too suddenly and it leaped over the grade embankment, tearing away the planks of the fence. Three building posts were snapped off as if by kindling wood and the car, going too fast to overturn, landed safely in the mud and rock of the low land. The car was helped out of its perilous position, backed up onto dry land, the five passengers took their seats and returned to town at the rate of thirty miles an hour, with only scratches upon one person. It is considered to be among the miracles of automobilism.
