Many of Saylor's fights have been won by a knockout.

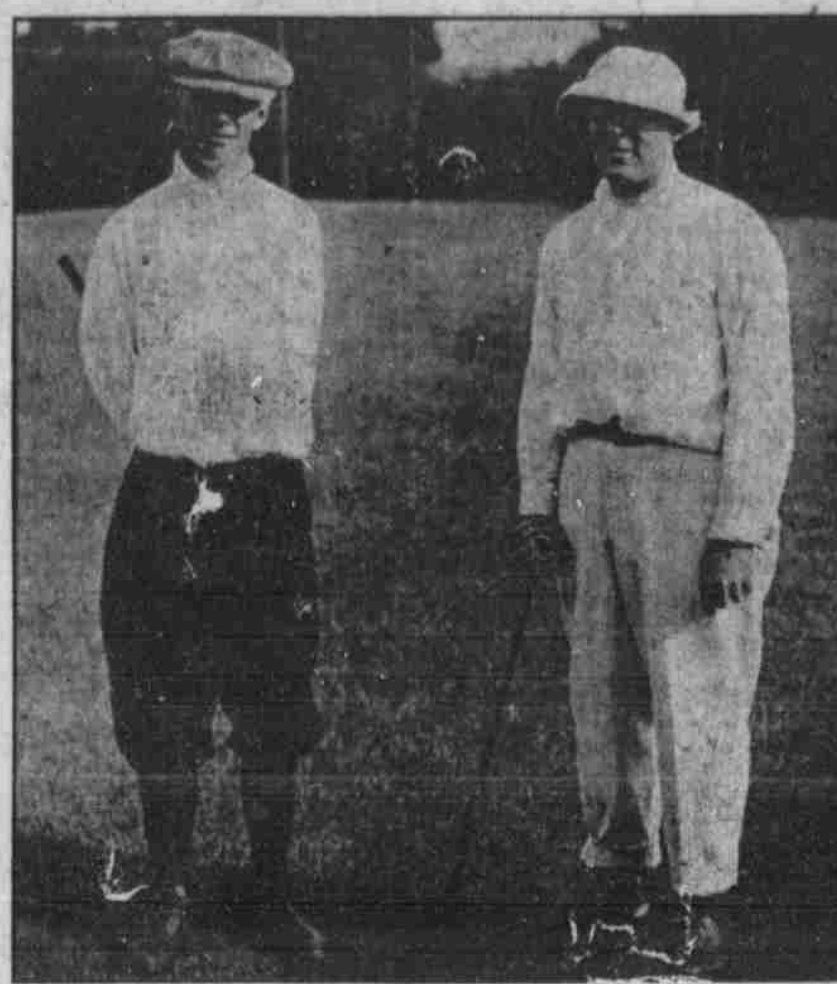

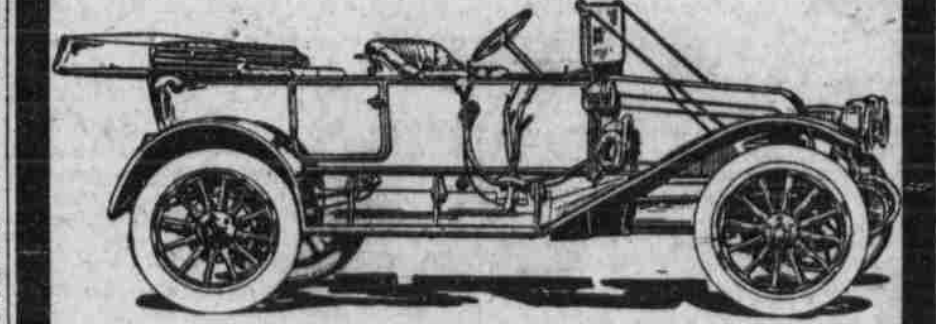
The original intention of the proposed national circuit was to provide a series of

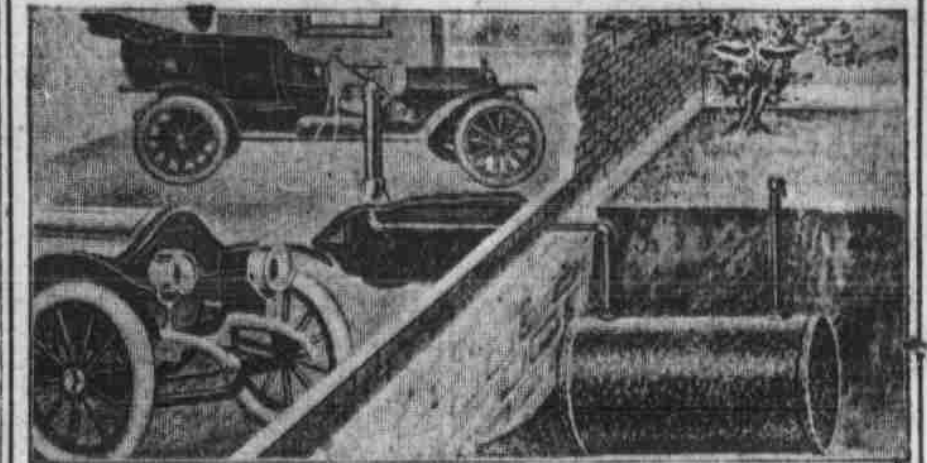
