

POINTERS FOR THE MOTORIST Some Timely Suggestions on the Proper Care and Treatment

of Rims.

Rust is an enemy of rubber. It will pay the motorist to inspect occasionally the condition of the rims on the wheels of his car, especially if the outer surface of the envelopes near the beads look rusty. This discoloration is rust caused by rusty rims. This rust if not arrested will gradually eat through the rubber, attacking the canvas of the envelope. In time the edges of the rusted rims will become more and more uneven, tearing and eventually destroying he beads. 


