UNITY PASTOR EMERITUS TALKS With Unity Church Twenty-One Years, Comes Back from Charge in Wisconsin to Speak at Old Congregation.

The Rev. Newton Mann, pastor emeritus of Unity church, will occupy the pulpit at the morning services June 18 and 19, following an absence of some months from the city. His subjects here, June 18, "Pessimism," and June 19, "Commonwealth." A treat is in store for those who attend. Rev. Mr. Mann is now pastor of a church at Kenosha, Wis., that was founded fifty years ago. He was with Unity church here for twenty-one years.
