High Cables and Hot Spell Continue
Bullish Sentiment.

WINTER WHEAT HARVEST IS ON

There is strong determination to
sell Corn Futures on Theory of
Serious Drought Damaging
Growing Crop.

OMAHA, June 20, 1911.
With cables higher and a dry, hot
weather over the entire country there
was a continuation of the bullish
sentiment of yesterday. The winter wheat
crop is being harvested and the spring
wheat to date has been in good condition.
The situation is being closely watched
because of the calamity in the northwest last
year, with the trade being unduly influ-
enced by premature reports.

There is a strong determination made to
sell corn futures on the theory of serious
drought damaging the growing crop later in
the season, with reports of some injury
already done in southern Iowa. More rain
is needed, and while it continues dry
corn values will be higher.

Damage reports in the northwest opened
very sharply higher, and shorts covered,
leaving further advance in value and
back to opening values on profit-taking
sales. Cash wheat was 11 1/2c higher.
The corn market was advanced on the
same features as wheat, and the advance
was well sustained. Cash corn was 10
cents higher.

Primary wheat receipts were 235,000 bushels
and shipments 100,000 bushels, against
receipts last year of 220,000 bushels and
shipments of 100,000 bushels.
