

GRAIN AND PRODUCE MARKET

Bullish Crop News from South Dakota Excites Shorts. DRY AND HOT IN THE CORN BELT Meteorological Conditions Cause a Continuation of Bullish Feeling and Brings an Advance in the Market.

The entire grain raising section of the country is suffering under another day of dry weather. Although temperatures were somewhat lower in the northwest, the bullish crop news from South Dakota excited shorts and caused the recent advance and unless weather conditions improve the damage will be heavy. Although the damage claim so far is a very small part of the spring wheat crop...

Wheat ruled firm, with some little advance. The market for wheat and long-grain are inclined to take profits. Cash wheat was higher. With no prospect of rain and continued high temperatures over the corn belt the buying continued and values worked higher. Cash receipts were 233,000 bu. and shipments were 222,000 bu. against receipts last year of 577,000 bu. and shipments of 231,000 bu.

Primary corn receipts were 524,000 bu. and shipments were 541,000 bu. against receipts last year of 470,000 bu. and shipments of 523,000 bu. The year-over closed 1/4 cent lower on wheat and 3/4 cent higher on corn.
