Athletes of Many Nations in Meet at Stamford, Eng.

F. L. Ramsdell of University of Pennsylvania Wins Both 100 and 220-Yard Races.

LONDON, July 2.—The best athletes in the United Kingdom, strong delegations from Canada and Australia and a few from the United States, are competing in the annual athletic association championships at Stamford bridge today. Weather conditions were excellent, but results were disappointing.

Several holders of world's records took part, but no world's records were broken. Most of the performances were mediocre.

The American representatives included F. L. Ramsdell of the University of Pennsylvania, Harry Gilling of the New York Athletic club, J. R. Kilpatrick of Yale and J. J. Daly of the Irish-American Athletic club.

Ramsdell won the 100 and 220-yard dashes, both in slow time. Gilling won his heat in the 100-yard dash, but got no place in the final.

Canada sent Frank L. Lukeman, A. M. Knox, G. M. Broch, F. Halbausa and J. L. Tait. Halbausa won the quarter-mile dash and was second in the 220-yard event. Tait finished second in the mile and Lukeman won his heat in the 100-yard dash and was second in the long jump.

Several Oxford and Cambridge men who will meet the Harvard-Yale team on July 11 competed, chiefly for practice. They were not trained to the mark, however.

G. E. Putnam of Ottawa, Kan., a Rhodes scholar at Oxford, won the hammer throw with 127 feet 7 inches. A. E. Flaxman, the present British champion, only succeeded in making a throw of 125 feet 1 inch.
