POTATOES GO HIGHER AGAIN

Vegetables from 100 to 300 Per Cent Higher Than Last Year.

FORRID WEATHER IS BLAMED

New Apples and Peaches Have Appeared in Omaha Market—Not Only High, but They Are of Poor Quality.

Listen to the vegetable dealer's tale of woe: Garden products and fruit have increased in price from 100 to 300 per cent since a year ago.

"Drouth," was the rejoinder when a commission man was asked "Why so?" In every part of the country the excessive heat and absence of rain have burned up the truck patches.

New potatoes, after maintaining the highest record in recollection of commission men, have risen from \$2.80 a bushel to \$3.50. New apples and peaches are seen in the market booths. Cantaloupes, which have been about the only thing on exhibit in the markets that has not increased in price, now is on the rise, having gone from \$1.50 a case to \$2.75.

Not only is the anomalous situation evinced in the price quotations, but in the quality of the garden products. It takes as much nerve to eat a blade of lettuce nowadays as it did for the proverbial hero who ate the first oyster. Raspberries taste more like nutmeg than the juicy fruit of fond memories. Lettuce has a bitter tang which practically spoils it for food.
