Conservative Traders Believe Wheat Price is Justified. STRONG CASH CORN SITUATION. Wheat Opens Strong and Rises Higher During Whole Session - Rust and Northwest Damage Featured in Trade.

OMAHA, July 22, 1911. Conservative traders in wheat believe that present prices are justified and if there is to be a further reduction in the northwest but that it should be an increase in values. Black rust reports have become so general that it is the feature of the day. The fact that domestic values have reached an export basis is affecting the heavy receipts of new wheat.

Primary corn receipts were 23,000 bu. and shipments were 40,000 bu. Cash corn was 54c lower. Primary wheat receipts were 1,458,000 bu. and shipments were 420,000 bu.
