BIG AIR CONTEST STARTS

Nineteen Aviators Make First Flight of Twenty Miles.

Forty Thousand Persons Gather at Aero Club Grounds and More Than One Hundred Thousand Crowd Neighboring Hillsides.

BROOKLANDS, Eng., July 23.—In tricky weather for airmen, the start was made yesterday for the \$50,000 prize offered by the Daily Mail for the 1,000 miles' flight around England. Nineteen aviators, out of thirty entered, essayed the first section of a two-day London to London. Three, however, failed to get outside of the aerodrome. Lieutenant John C. Porte of the British navy fell from a height of sixty feet, wrecking his machine, but sustaining only a few scratches. Another Englishman, P. C. Jenkins, had a similar fall, but escaped unharmed, while a third Englishman, E. C. Gordon, was unable to get his machine to rise. The others got away well, a Beumont (Lieutenant de Conneau) and other Frenchmen making brilliant starts. T. Weymann, the American representative, in a Nieuport monoplane, had bad luck. After what looked to be a favorable start, a balky engine forced him to return, but he soon got away again.

Big Crowd at Finish.

Beumont, winner of the Paris-Rome and European circuit races, arrived first, covering the distance at the rate of about a mile a minute. Vedrine, winner of the Paris-Madrid race, was next, his pace being even faster than Beumont's. All descended safely. The average time of the aviators was 25 minutes. Lieutenant Cannel was compelled to descend at Housouev Heath, because of a broken valve, and his passage time was three and one-half hours. The American, Weymann, because of having failed to return to the aerodrome after his first start, took almost an hour for the twenty miles.
