WING SENTENCED FOR THEFTS

Youth Who Took Autos for Joy Rides Gets Indeterminate Sentence.

DRAWS ONE SEVEN YEARS Attorney Asks That a Parole Will Be Asked For After Wing Has Served One Year of His Term.

Arthur E. Wing, confessed automobile thief, was denied parole and sentenced to one to seven years in the penitentiary at Lincoln by Judge Lee S. Estelle Thursday morning.

Wing was arraigned on two charges of grand larceny, one for the theft of Levi's trousers, valued at \$10.00, and one for the theft of Miss Jessie Amos' car, valued at \$100.00.

After Wing had entered his pleas of guilty Judge Estelle asked him if he had anything to say for himself. The young man turned to his attorney, E. G. McCall, who came forward to make a brief speech in the boy's behalf.

The attorney said that never before has a sentence of such length for a first offense been pronounced in the penitentiary at Lincoln. He stated that the sentence should be served concurrently, and that they are in effect one sentence for one to seven years.

Wing's attorneys will seek a parole or a pardon at the hands of the state prison board as soon as the minimum of the sentence—one year—has expired.

The case against W. E. Wing, father of the auto thief, was not taken up. It probably will be dismissed, as there is little or no evidence that he was concerned in the thefts.

After Wing had entered his pleas of guilty Judge Estelle asked him if he had anything to say for himself. The young man turned to his attorney, E. G. McCall, who came forward to make a brief speech in the boy's behalf.
