HESSE CHARGED WITH DEATH

Coroner's Jury Returns Verdict on Two Bodies Found in Tecumseh.

TECUMSEH, Neb., Aug. 16.—(Special Telegram.)—The two bodies removed from the site well here yesterday were those of Mrs. E. E. Hesse and her daughter, Waveria McMaister, and that they were killed by E. E. Hesse in a matter determined by the jury, was the outcome of the coroner's jury when the verdict was reached at 2:30 o'clock this morning.

Family Quarrels Frequent

Twenty-three witnesses were examined, Coroner Charles Stone keeping an accurate record of all names and giving people out of bed to appear at the scene. From the evidence of neighbors it seemed Mr. Hesse and Mrs. Hesse did not get along well, though the stipulator seemed to get along very well with Waveria. Former fellow workmen did not know the probable whereabouts of Hesse, nor did members of the local depot force, Charles Plostering, the man who worked in the well all day and uncovered and prepared the bodies for burial, swore that a bundle of fire bricks with a wire near the body of Mrs. Hesse, and on that of the girl was a large stone, these being used to weight them down.
