Complete Returns Received from Sixty Counties on Supreme Judge.

ALBERT AND STARK RACE CLOSE

Republican Ticket Settled on Count. State First Named—Hall Leading Strobe by What Seems Safe Majority.

On the count of the vote cast at the party on Tuesday it will be impossible to progress far enough to indicate with reasonable certainty the outcome. Sixty-one counties have made reports on the primary judge on the republican ticket. These are 63.5% votes, and the tabulation of these shows that Judge Rose and Letton have been re-nominated, while Judge Francis G. Harner has replaced Judge Rose. Judge Letton is running ahead of Rose, but far enough behind Letton to make it certain that the latter is re-nominated.
