

CROP REPORTS ARE GATHERED

One Elevator Company Reports Lower Yield for This Year. EIGHTY PER CENT CORN CROP SCOrching Driver

Oats Will Drop to Thirty-Two Per Cout and Corn May Not Reach Three-Fourths of a Normal Crop.

For some time the Omaha grain dealers have been seeking to get a line on crop conditions in Nebrasks and Iows. About the middle of August they sent a line of inquiries to grain dealers and elevator men in the two states, instructing the parties to whom inquirtes were sent to place their own estimates on the yield of corn and oats in their immediate vicinity.

Among the first of the reports to be received have been by the Cavers Elevator company. A summary shows that an average on eighty reports covering the entire corn belt of Nebraska gives the estimate of the present growing crop of corn to be 78 per cent of the crop of 1910, and the yield of cats for 1911 to be 22 per cent of that

On Nebraska Ranges. In parts of Polk and York counties and

at a few stations in the southern part of the state, also in a small territory on the Burlington west of Loup City and Ra- of Iowa. venna these reports show the present corn crop to be equal to or better than 1910. Except as heretofore noted the estimates of the growing corn crop in all Nebraska

range from 60 to 75 per cent of the crop of 1910. The lower estimates include northeastern Nebraska, which is the best corn territory in the state, therefore, the average of 78 per cent is thought to be high To analyze these reports instead of taking an average indicates that the present crop is about 65 to 70 per cent of the crop of 1910. The average of twenty reports from lowa which cover only the western part of the state from Council Blufts north show that the yield of the growing crop of corn will be 55 per cent of the crop of 1910 and that the yield of oats in 1911 is 67 per cent of
