OMAHA, August 30. The northwest forecast was generally warmer and showery, temperatures ranging from 61 to 64 degrees. Some importance was given reports on a passage of the Canadian reciprocity bill, stating passage almost certain. News generally was considered bullish and encouraged longer wheat selling on the basis of any success in securing most receipts. Carrying charges and heavy stocks are against the advance and prices receded off.
