Kearney Saloon Keeper Wins Appeal
Jury in District Court Finds Martin Moran Not Guilty of Selling Liquor at Illegal Hours

Moran, a saloon-keeper, charged with having violated the 11 o'clock closing law in that he sold intoxicating liquor out of hours, brought in a verdict of acquittal this afternoon, after deliberating twenty minutes. The case was fought bitterly before the district court by the city attorney, E. C. Calkins, and the counsel for the defense, Judge H. M. Sinclair and T. F. Hamer.

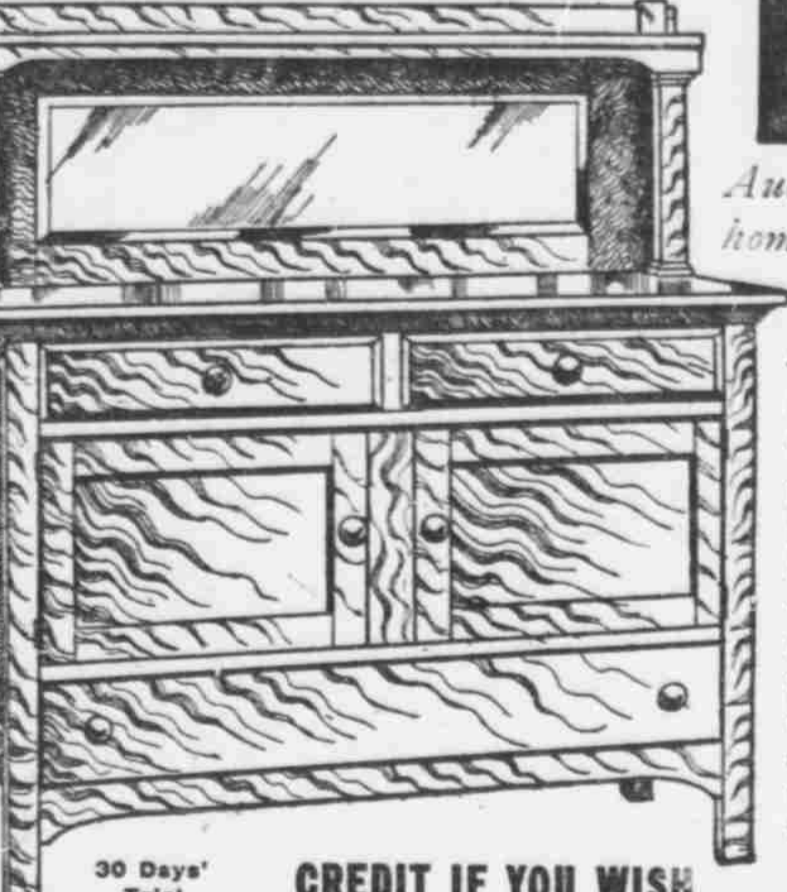
