KANE BATS OUT GAME FOR OMAHA

Three-Base Hit in Opening Inning Drives in Two Ahead of Him.

Jimmie Kane, the Rockies first baseman, broke up yesterday's game with the Hoopfuls from Des Moines by slugging out a three-base hit, scoring two men who had gotten on base on a pass and an error. Robinson did the hitting and pitched right-hand ball, allowing six hits and but one run. The final score was 4 to 1, with the Hoopfuls trailing in the dust.
