

Pardun, proprietor of the Henshaw-hotel barber shop, and one of his employes, John Scott, but a continuance was taken until Wednesday, September 38.

According to evidence introduced by the plaintiffs in the trial against Rentfrow. three men were shaved on September 3. but the barbers refused to take the money, telling the customers to put the 15 cents in the cash register themselves.
