**Performs with Bees.**  
Daniel in the lion's den has a rival in Frank G. Odell, the bee man, who will appear at the Land Show as an attraction. This exhibit is one of the most interesting to the average person. Mr. Odell enters a screen den where a hive of bees is confined and handles them in an apparently careless manner that makes spectators, remembering the stings they received in their youth, wonder what kind of a gift he has. Instead of putting his head in the lion's mouth, he puts the bees in his mouth. Another trick of his is to pour a handful down the inside of his shirt bosom while speaking, and then some minutes afterwards, let them free again. He says he has never received a sting on the body while performing this trick. While in the cage with his strange pets he lectures on bee culture and honey making, casually picking up a handful of bees and letting them trickle through his fingers from time to time. For amusement he picks the bees off the screen of the cage and puts them to bed.  
Mr. Odell makes a specialty of breeding queen bees. He has several hives of bees with him, including golden Italians, red clover Italians and Caucasian bees. The latter are known as stinging bees for the reason that they seldom sting, while the red clover bees have a much longer tongue than the

Every step of his progress from the time he is an ordinary clerk until he is a prosperous farmer is depicted in an interesting manner.
