CHINA AN AWAKENING GIANT

Dobson Says Revolt Identified with Christian Movement.

MISSIONARIES DO BIG WORK

Real Power of New Force in China Due to Converted Chinese—

Empire Too Great for Mind to Grasp.

China, the giant of the world, who has been asleep for centuries, is awakening, and when fully aroused will stir this world as it has never been stirred before.

These were some of the declarations made in an hour's address yesterday afternoon at the Young Men's Christian association building by George L. Dobson, former United States consul at Hankow, China, and for four years Iowa's secretary of state.

Mr. Dobson dwelt largely upon the importance and extent of the missionary work in the Celestial kingdom, and declared that the greatest part of it is being done by the Methodist churches of the United States.

The real work is being done by the converted Chinese. They have started an enormous energy that cannot stop until it sweeps over the whole kingdom and comes to rest after completely changing everything in the social and religious lives of a people that has withstood the assaults of thousands of years.

No mind is great enough to grasp China. The world knows little about it, only a little shimmering knowledge, like a distant survey of shore line from the sea. China is accredited with having 300,000,000 people, but no one knows within 100,000,000 of the number.

Mr. Dobson said he was obliged to revise all of his supposed knowledge of China when he went there in 1907. He had read Marco Polo's description of the city of Hankow, which was declared to be the most beautiful city in the world, with 1,500 public baths.

There were 1,500 people in the city who took a bath once a year. He had heard so often about American trust magnates selling farm machinery and threshing machines in China at less cost than at home.

There are no present indications of a disturbance in the Gulf of Mexico or the West Indies, says the statement.

In the United States the temperature will average low for the season over practically all districts from the Rocky mountains to the Atlantic coast and there will be frosts Monday in the interior of the Gulf states and in the Ohio valley, and by Tuesday or Wednesday in the middle Atlantic and elevated regions in the south Atlantic states.

The precipitation will be the normal generally. There will be rain or snow Monday in the region of the Great Lakes.

The next general disturbance to cross the country will appear in the northwest Tuesday or Wednesday, advance eastward over the middle west Wednesday night or Thursday and the eastern states about Friday. This will be preceded by rising temperatures, attended by local areas of precipitation and will be followed by a change to considerably colder weather.
