## WESTERN NEBRASKA IS RICH

Great Cattle Ranges Are Converted Into Irrigated Farms.

## FINE POTATOES ARE GROWN

This is New Country and Most of Land Has Not Been Occupied for More Than Five Years—Small Fruits Do Well.

In an illustrated lecture at the Coliseum E. Von Forrell described the resources of the North Platte valley, the opportunities awaiting the settler there and the possibilities of further and more intensive cultivation of the soil. He said: "The North Platte valley, comprising the counties of Scott's Bluff and Morrill, in Nebraska, and Goshen county, Wyoming, is some times called the Valley of the Nile, because of its fertility, as well as its abundant water supply.  
"A quarter of a century ago large herds of cattle roamed here at will. It was the paradise of the cattle man. About this time the settlers came in large numbers to dispute the rights of the herdsman. Adverse conditions for agriculture in the semi-arid west, which condition was due largely to a lack of knowledge of how to till the soil to conserve the moisture, which was not often insufficient to produce crops, compelled many to leave. Some stayed, however, and won.  
"About a score of years ago someone conceived the idea that diverting the water from the North Platte river through ditches upon the land was feasible. This trial proved successful beyond all ex-

## World in Itself is California

"California is an empire in itself," said Wilbur Walker of Alameda county, speaking at the Coliseum. "If the state were isolated from the rest of the world it would still be a world in itself, containing 135,650 square miles, the products from which would supply its population without calling on the outside for any of the essential articles of food or comfort. "Grapes, oranges, figs and pines thrive in the southern portion. In the central portion the cherry, the apricot, the plum grow, and in the northern portion the pear and the apple are produced. "Rhubarb, raised and shipped by the carload; cucumbers and garden peas are raised throughout the county. Sugar beets and hops are extensively cultivated. As more than a million people live within a radius of fifty miles there is an ample home market for products. The surplus is absorbed by numerous canneries and pickle factories. The county is also rapidly coming to the front as a manufacturing and mercantile center. "We have the only cotton mill west of the Mississippi, which is constantly employed on cotton grown in Imperial county, California.
