said anything of the sort. "I never mentioned Darrow's name to these men," he declared. "I owe it to Mr. Darrow to say that much, It's an absolute lie."

Previously Franklin said: "I might be guilty-though I don't for moment admit that-but I'm no fool." He refused to elaborate this declaration.
