It has been on exhibition at the salesrooms of the Bennett Company all during the contest. It will be sent to the home of the winner as soon as this individual has been identified at The Bee office.

The first prize in the Second Booklovers' Contest is a \$2,000 White Steamer Touring Car. It is a five-passenger model. It is richly upholstered, beautifully finished and strong built. This car is now at the Drummond salesrooms, 18th and Harney Sts.

The fourth prize is a business lot in Ralston. It is valued at \$275. Its size is 25x100 feet. It is located on one of the main streets of the growing town of Ralston, and is rapidly increasing in value.
