Letters are daily coming to the mayer and city clerk in response to the recent announcement of the sate of bonds incolving \$110,990. When the notions were first sent out it was feared that ensure bond buyers would not have fithe to get in their bids before the date of this December 12.

Mayor Trainer and City Clerk Frank 300d. in order to expedite matters, inclosed a financial statement in the letters cent to each bond buyer. As a result it is expected that there will be guite a umber of hidders at the sale.

There still remains the question of disposing of the money in a depository for the months of the winter, during which Unie the improvement work necessarily must be delayed. Heretofore the least banks have been accustomed 19 pay 2 per cent on the deposits. Recently a move was started to obtain the raise over

per cent on the depealts, but the offer was never made formally. Splizer & Co. of Toledo have signified

their willingness to pay 4 per cent on money realized from improvement bonds during the time that the money is not actually subject to the city's call. City Attorney H. C. Murphy favors this last plan and has advised the council of his stand. On the other hand, the office of the city treasurer objects to the transfer of the money to a foreign corporation because of the fact that they would be liable for the money taken out of its charge for the time of its deposit. The treasurer in the event that the council adopts the Toledo plan will ask to be relieved of his official bond insofar as

the funds in question are concerned. Another program contemplates the withholding of the sale of bonds until such time as they are in absolute need.

It is maintained that by such an arrangement the city would not be called upon to pay interest during the four or six months of winter and early spring in which the work cannot be carried on.
