MACVEAGH PREDICTS DEFICIT

Secretary of Treasury Estimates Year's Expense at \$635,184,563.

HE PROPOSES TWO REFORMS

Financial System and Methods of Collecting Customs Should Be. Revised in Light of Ex-

pertence.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 18,-Appeals for the immediate reform of the country's banking and currency system and scientific tariff legislation, based upon entirely new reasons—the practical experiprominently in the annual report of Secretary of the Treasury MacVeagh, submitted to congress today.

The secretary of the treasury foresees, according to the estimate of experts, a surplus in the treasury at the end of the fiscal year 1913 of about \$29,000,000, exclusive of expenditures on the Panama canal. Including the estimated canal disbursements the treasury will face a deficit of approximately \$18,000,000. The total estimates of expenditures for next year, exclusive of the Panama canal and the postal service, payable from postal revenue, are \$637,930,803. The estimates of recelpts available for the general fund are \$657,000,000. The estimates for the construction of the Panama canal during the next year are \$47,263,760, making a grand total of estimated expenditures of \$685,-184,560.
