## Recorder Turns Money to County

The annual report of County Recorder Barghausen and his settlement with the county treasurer were made yesterday. His report will be cramined and ap-proved by the Board of County Supercisors at their January meeting. The report shows the filing of 7,067 instruments during 1911. The total collections for recording all of these deeds and other Instruments was \$5,102.75. Under the rule that all filing fees must be paid in adcance not a cent was lost during the year. Recorder Barghausen's salary is \$1,800 a year, his office thus turning over to the county treasurer \$3,206.25 net. The pay for deputy hire, however, will absorb approximately all of this.
