Pioneer Citizen of Omaha Dies Suddenly at His Home.

WAS AROUND TOWN FRIDAY

Hanlon Came to Omaha Soon After the War, Began Career Here as a Trucker and Became Wealthy.

Frank P. Hanlon, well known capitalist and pioneer, died at 2 o'clock yesterday morning at his home, 820 South Nineteenth street...

He was suddenly seized with severe pains in his legs while playing solitaire in Robertson Bros' Fifteenth street cigar store Friday afternoon...

Mr. Hanlon was 65 years old last Christmas day. He was born in England and came to Omaha in 1870...

He came to Omaha soon after the war and his first job was pushing a truck in the Union Pacific freight house...

He was a pioneer constable, served as a deputy under Sheriff Burley, and became local ticket agent for the Hannibal & St. Joseph railroad...

He finally became confidential agent of President Clark of the Union Pacific and called himself the "outside general manager."

He saved his money in the early days and put it into land in the Elkhorn valley, selling it later at great profit...

He was married in Montana. In the early days and his wife died in Omaha a few months later...

Mr. Hanlon was a close friend of Count Creighton, W. A. Paxton, Mark Coad and other pioneers, now dead, and of former Senator Joseph Millard.
