New Books

UNDER WESTERN SKIES. By Joseph Conrad. 25 Pp. \$1.25. Harper & Brothers. Fiction. The central figure is Kyrilo Sidorovitch Razumov, a young Russian student of liberal tendencies. The opening of the story describes the assassination of a Russian official and the taking refuge in Razumov's room of the student friend who had thrown the successful bomb. This man believes implicitly that Razumov is one of them, and has the greatest admiration for the honesty and sincerity of his character. Razumov honestly believes the revolutionaries are on the wrong track and despises their methods, and ends after a struggle with himself in betraying his friend to the police. After that the logic of events makes of him a successful government spy. The story is told in the person of an elderly English teacher of languages, who has been nearly all of it upon Razumov's diary. Most of the action takes place in Geneva. THE FAITHFUL FAILURE. By Roseamond Napier. 40 Pp. \$1.25. Hodder & Stoughton. The story of two lovers who rob each moment of the last drop of gladness, who meet defeat with a jest and success with rapture. A genuine Bohemian success runs through the book and may be summed up in these words: Live the present furiously, forget the past, and trust for luck to the future. THE GODS AND MR. PERRIN. By Hugh Walpole. 28 Pp. \$1.25. The Century. 'Maffrat' is a second class boys' school in Cornwall, dominated by Moryn Thompson, the cruel and tyrannical head master. The boys' driving and the mental discomfit of Mr. Perrin are brought out, and against this background is pictured the coming of Tralli, young, vigorous, hopeful; the influence upon him of this abnormal world, his winning of Isabel's love and Perrin's hate. A HAND IN THE GAME. By Gardner Hunting. 223 Pp. \$1.25. Henry Holt & Co. Love reaches out both hands to Dan Randall through an April snow bank. A mischance breaks a way for him into a lovely girl's life and makes opportunity for him to fight for her against an enemy who holds a strangely cruel weapon. A blind mystery and the deadly hatred of a corrupted foe, makes the revenge as mingled in a bewildering potion. Burglaries have been committed in the neighborhood of Lord Garvington's home, and he has said he will shoot any one attempting to enter his home. The next night a man makes the attempt and is wounded, and the story hinges on who fired the fatal shot. THE INDISCRETIONS OF A MAISTER REDHORN. By J. J. Bell. 167 Pp. 9 cents. Fleming H. Revell company. The author has given us another precocious boy whose pranks make smiling reading, and one enjoys the deft touches that bring out the tang of Scotch character in the quaint painter and his various gossipy neighbors. Juvenile. HARMONY HALL. By Marion Hill. 39 Pp. \$1.00. Small, Maynard & Co. Harmony Hall is a girl—a wholly delightful, charming American girl who does some heartening things in a lovable way and a very original way, too. Her story, which is the first of a series, is told in the author's most sprightly manner. THE YOUNG ALASKANS ON THE TRAIL. By Emerson Hough. 230 Pp. \$1.25. Harper & Bros. This is the second book in the series. Bob McIntyre, Jesse Wilcox and Jim Hardy, a year older now, are sent by their Uncle Dick on their summer vacation to cross the Rocky mountain divide by the old route taken by the first transcontinental explorers. GREAT BEAR ISLAND. By Arthur E. McFarlane. 25 Pp. \$1.25. Little, Brown & Co. The adventures of four boys who spend the summer in the northern woods. They are sent by their fathers to find and befriend a harmless, half-witted man. Ninny Niggins, who has been made the butt of cruel jokes by the men of the logging and lumber camps. How they find 'Ninny,' how they fish and hunt and discover the prehistoric mound which gives the island its name, make a story full of fascination to boy readers. THE SULTAN'S RIVAL. By Bradley Gilman. 223 Pp. \$1.25. Small, Maynard & Co. An exciting story of adventure in the wild country of Morocco. A boy's character is greatly determined by the character he keeps; and the author gives the reader the companionship of two manly young fellows in a wild land among savage races. THE PECKS IN CAMP. By A. T. Dudley. 22 Pp. \$1.25. Lothrop Lee & Shepard Co. The Pecks are twin brothers, so resembling each other that it is almost impossible to tell them apart, a fact which the roguish lads make the most of. The scene of this book is laid in a summer camp for boys, with a great rivalry between two 'lodges,' or houses in which the boys live. WINNING THE JUNIOR CUP. By Norman Brainerd. 25 Pp. \$1.25. Lothrop, Lee & Shepard company. The plot moves swiftly through class room and dormitory life and stirring athletic contests, and events conspire to place the hero in a position that only one of uncommon will power and stability of character could endure. CHASED ACROSS THE PAMPAR. By Edward Stratemeyer. 250 Pp. \$1.25. Lothrop, Lee & Shepard Co. This is the sixth volume of the 'Pan-American series.' This time Sam and
