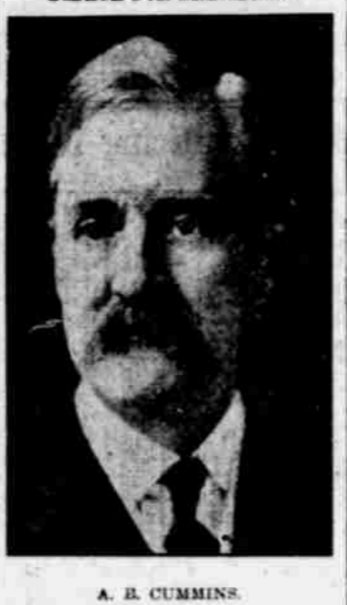
Many Pearls in Oysters

SUICIDE RATE DECREASES

Statistics Show Fewer Deaths in United States During Year.

OMAHA HAS HIGH AVERAGE

Figures Show Sixteen of Every Hundred Thousand Kill Selves—Poison Favorite Tool, Poison Second Choice.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 21.—Fewer people committed suicide during 1910 than in 1909, according to the latest statistics on the subject, announced today by Dr. Cresley L. Wilbur, chief statistician for vital statistics of the United States census bureau.

San Francisco Leads Cities. In the registration of over 100,000 population, San Francisco had 4.2 suicides per 100,000 led.

Next came Kansas City, Mo., with 3.4; Oakland, Cal., with 3.4; Seattle, with 3.1; Bridgeport, Conn., with 2.1, and Denver with 2.4.

The rate in cities of 100,000 or over was: Omaha, 2.9; Birmingham, Ala., 2.3; Los Angeles, 2.2; Denver, 2.2; Washington, D. NEW YORK, Jan. 20.—Porter Charlton, who murdered his wife, Mrs. Mary Scott Castle Charlton, at Lake Como, in Italy, in 1910, is perfectly sane, according to the district attorney of Hudson county, New Jersey, and the Jersey City jail officers. He is in splendid health.

At the office of the district attorney it was said there was absolutely no chance of the young man being released on bail and that he will remain in jail pending the outcome of the proceedings which are to determine whether he is to be returned to Italy for trial. The case is now before the supreme court of the United States and a decision is not expected before some time early in 1912.

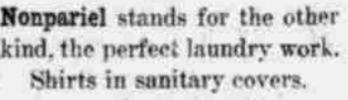
