The speech was re-garded as a keynote of the administration efforts in launching a country wide campaign. Desides the editors, republi-can party leaders from all over the state attended the banquet. Senator Brown reviewed at considerable longth what had been accomplished by

President Taft and the republican party and laid the greatest strees on the Payne-Aldrich tariff law, railroad regulation, direct election of United States senators, income tax amendment, en-forcement of the anti-trust law and other measures and the peace treaties. In discussing the Payne tariff bill Sena-ter Brown said: "The Payne law has closed no factory; it has reduced the wages of no man; it has denied labor not a single opportun-

has desided labor not a single opportun-ity; under it the farmer has prospered.
