BROWN LAUDS TAFT'S ACTS

Nebraska Senator Addresses Indiana Republican Editors. EXECUTIVE GUARDS THE NATION While Congress Talks, President Acts to Protect People—Tariff Law and Railroad Regulation Party Achievements.

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., Jan. 26.—Achievements of President Taft's administration were defended last night by Senator Norris Brown of Nebraska, at the annual banquet of the republican editors of Indiana.

Senator Brown reviewed at considerable length what had been accomplished by President Taft and the republican party and laid the greatest stress on the Payne-Aldrich tariff law, railroad regulation, direct election of United States senators, income tax amendment, enforcement of the anti-trust law and other measures and the peace treaty.

In discussing the Payne tariff bill Senator Brown said: "The Payne law has closed no factory; it has reduced the wages of no man; it has denied labor not a single opportunity; under it the farmer has prospered. It has in no way impaired the general prosperity of the people. And yet the law can be improved. It should be improved a schedule at a time, and this will be done if the president and the republican party have their way.

Today congress has passed a message from the president demanding the reduction of duties in one schedule based on the facts as shown by the experts of the tariff board.

Corporation Tax Law. "The tariff law contained two other propositions other than tariff duties which so far to give the measure a good name. It contained a provision to tax corporations, thereby compelling those men who prefer to enjoy the profits and immunities of doing business with the public to incorporate rather than as individuals, to contribute to the support of the federal government. That provision alone has brought to the national treasury in round numbers more than \$25,000,000 a year since it became effective.

Senator Brown said it was "left to the Taft administration to complete the job of clothing the Interstate Commerce commission with power actually to prevent an increase in rates until after investigation by the commission, and by declaring any change in rates unlawful unless first consented to by the commission." He said he well remembered the debate in the senate on that feature of the law, and while the debate was proceeding "the railroads were also proceeding to increase freight rates."

Taft Protects Public. "It is good to know," said Senator Brown, "that while congress talked, the president of the United States was on guard for the people, and the day before the increase would be come effective President Taft invoked the power of the court and in the name of the United States stopped by injunction every increase proposed by the railroads. Again it was the executive arm of the government and not congress which saved a helpless public from a great wrong. It is not possible that republicans will hesitate to approve public service of that character."

Senator Brown declared that for more than half a century the people have been demanding the right to elect by direct vote United States senators, and that while the proposition never found a place in the national platform of the republican party, it was advocated by President Taft in his acceptance message.

Referring to the income tax amendment now pending before the states, Senator Brown said that the resolution providing for this amendment was introduced peacefully in committee until President Taft, by special message, admonished congress that such an amendment was right and should be passed and submitted to the states.

Party is Responsible. "If the press of the United States would tell the whole truth about President Taft," said the senator in conclusion, "there would not be enough democratic votes in the electoral college to make a quorum." He said that if there is any credit to be claimed or any blame to be imposed for what has been done so far during Taft's administration, it belongs to the republican party as well as to the president.

"We cannot condemn one without impeaching the other. We cannot praise one without commending both," he declared.

Senator Brown paid tributes to former republican presidents, including Colonel Roosevelt, and referring to a third term, he said that and Theodore Roosevelt never led to the American people, and when he said he did not want to be president again he meant what he said.

"Every man who doubts that statement now impeaches his integrity. I have honored and trusted him too many years to insult him now with the thought that he says one thing and means another," concluded the Nebraskan.
