ment ordered the despatch of four war-ships to Paraguay in anticipation of the breaking off of diplomatic relations. The Argentine foreign minister recently in-structed the Argentine minister at Asun-cion to present a formal claim for com-pensation for the attacks on Argentine shipping and property. The Paraguayan government refused to discuss the mat-ter and the minister was then instructed to demand satisfaction within twenty-four hours. The trouble arose through Paraguayan revolutionists firing, on Argentine vessels lying in Asundon har-hor.
