GRAIN AND PRODUCE MARKET Firm Feeling Rules in the Wheat Future Market. MAY OPTION IS A CENT HIGHER Despite Liberal Movement of Corn That Grains Refuses to Decline in Price to Any Appreciable Extent.

OMAHA, Jan. 27, 1912. There was a noticeable absence of selling pressure on hog products. The bulge in wheat appeared to serve as a restraint for traders, but was inclined to hold the short side of the market.
