Feature Term Bates. Term rates for periods of life to 20, "Term rates for periods of life to 50, 60 and 70 years of age, and ending at these ages, are a special feature of the revision," said Mr. Pratt. "Old members with life certificates, who do not wish to increase their assuments may elect before to one of the three ages. Old members up to 50 years of age may be rerated at their sitained ages, counting from the birth-day nearest the date of transfer.

"For instance, a member 55 years old

"For instance, a member 15 years old can obtain \$500 protection for a monthly payment of \$1.50, \$1.000 protection for \$3 a munch and so on up to \$5,000 protection for \$8. On the \$5,000 certificate he would be obliged to pay only \$5 a month if he should so wish, the remainder being subtracted, with 4 per cent interest, from the certificate at the time of his death.
