SOUTH LIKES NEBRASKA CORN
Demand from the Gulf States is Rapidly Increasing.
THEY WANT NORTHERN CORN
Indications that Shipments, Which are Already Large, Will Increase During the Next Sixty Days.
Railroad men believe that a new market has been established for Nebraska corn and that in the future the planters of all of the southern states west of the Mississippi river will take their supplies of this cereal from this point.
In the past, much of the corn fed by the southern planters has been purchased in southern Kansas and Oklahoma. In these states, last season the corn crop, owing to the dry weather, was almost a complete failure. As a result there was no corn to ship. Then the southern planters began to look elsewhere for their supply. They took some of the Nebraska corn and at once pronounced it superior to that they had used in the past. Result was that large orders were placed.
Railroad men say that of the thousands of cars of corn shipped out of Omaha during the last week, the most of it has gone to the plantations and feed lots of the south and very little for export.
While the corn movement out of Omaha has reached gigantic proportions during the last month, far outstripping Chicago, St. Louis and Kansas City, railroad freight men declare that it is nothing compared with what may be expected within a short time. Reports received by them are to the effect that the farmers of Nebraska and western Iowa have marketed but a small portion of last year's crop. The present high prices have brought out some, but the greater portion is held back in the crib, from whence it will come during the next sixty days.

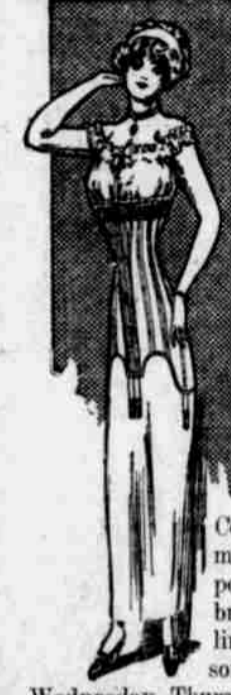
