BELIEVED ROAD DEAL SECURE. J. J. Heas Returns from East, Where He Has Spent Week. SHAW SAYS DRAFT IS GOOD. Lawyers Concerned in Sale of Atlantic Northern & Southern Satisfied Big Draft Will Be Met When Due.

Attorney J. J. Heas and A. S. Leonard, cashier of the Treasury, have filed a report from the east where they have spent the last week in closing up some matters of the sale of the Atlantic Northern & Southern and the Iowa & Omaha railroads. Both men seemed to be abundantly satisfied with the results of their work and pronounced the situation satisfactory.

Local interest in the completion of the sale of the roads is keen for the reason that several hundred people, contractors, merchants, bankers and farmers, have several hundred thousand dollars tied up which will be released and put back into the channels of trade whenever the \$400,000 London draft brought here and exhibited at the time the receiver's sale of the country lines was approved by Judge Arthur is cashed.

The report that reached Council Bluffs a few days ago that the cash represented by the draft had been deposited at Philadelphia was unfortunately not confirmed by Mr. Heas and Mr. Hancock yesterday. Both said, however, that there was no cause for uneasiness from that fact. At Philadelphia they were in conference for several days with former Secretary Leslie M. Shaw, who has undertaken to look after the financial end of the proposition. Their assurances from Mr. Shaw were that the draft would be cashed before March 15, the time specified, or even before February 15, if the final details in connection with the transfer of the property could be fully completed.

"The deal is not entirely closed up," said Mr. Heas last evening, "but all of the main issues have been, and now nothing is to be done but to close up the details. These all relate to minor matters and are not likely to delay, much less affect the main chance. There isn't a cloud in the sky that I can discern that can cast a shadow on our hopes for the early final settlement. We have Governor Shaw's assurance that the money end of it is all right and that is sufficient."

In New York Mr. Heas met Mr. Kiernan, whose rather unenviable record in the financial world in connection with the loss of nearly \$1,000,000 of Catholic funds through the failure of the financial institution under his management has caused the only doubt about the genuineness of the London draft. Mr. Heas in no degree shares in this slight apprehension and says that Kiernan is simply the financial agent of the London financial institution which issued the draft. Mr. Heas could not state just when the deal would be finally closed, but said he had a lot of immediate detail work to do in connection with it.
