



to Save the Difference in Transportation Cost.


With market conditions ideal another record run of hogs was made at the South Omaha yards yetserday. At noon an estimate of 30,000 head was made, this being more than 6,000 above the record of January 23, when 23,610 parkers arrived Tuesday's receipts were the largest for of Jus any one day in the history of the yards, and almost equals the Chicago receipts which are 21,000 head.

Omaha prices yesterday were the same as paid in Chicago and the result is that the lowa farmers are deserting the Chicago market. By so doing they save the amount necessary to haul their hogs to that place.


