GRAIN AND PRODUCE MARKET

Bulls in Wheat Disappointed in Their Theories. PRESSURE ON CORN IS LIGHT

Recent Heavy Run Was Only Natural After the Blocked Condition of Roads During Severe Weather.

OMAHA, Feb. 13, 1914. Bulls in wheat have been disappointed in their theories based on probable shortage in reserves in the spring wheat country.

Liverpool today was some higher and caused a temporary rally in domestic markets.

There has been no such selling pressure on the corn market as might be expected with the decline in wheat.

Wheat reacted on the strength of Liverpool cables showing a demand for cash wheat sold 1/16 higher.

Good cash demand and excellent speculative support advanced the corn market.

Primary corn receipts were 25,000 bushels and shipments were 23,000 bushels.

Clearances were 45,000 bushels of corn, 600 bushels of oats and wheat and flour.

Liverpool closed 1/4 lower to 1/4 higher on wheat and 1/4 lower on corn.
