GERMANS COUNTER THE DRYS

Anti-Saloon League Attitude Toward Charles Nagel is Resented.

SEND PROTEST TO PRESIDENT

German-American Alliance of Nebraska Denounces League's Action as Unwarranted and Impertinent.

Nebraska Germans have made forcible remonstrance against the efforts of the State Anti-Saloon League, which seeks to prevent the appointment of Charles Nagel, secretary of commerce and labor, to a seat on the United States supreme bench.

"We hereby denounce their action as an unwarranted and impertinent interference with your executive prerogative; and speaking adversely for more than 60,000 voters of Nebraska, whose devotion to the cause of personal liberty we can vouch for, we beg to assure you that the appointment to a place on the supreme bench of Mr. Nagel, whose qualifications for that position and his splendid record in his profession, as well as a public officer, are fully recognized by a large majority of the voters of this state, would be most heartily endorsed and appreciated by this alliance.

"We consider that the objections made by the Anti-Saloon league to Mr. Nagel's appointment on the grounds that he has acted in a professional capacity for Adolphus Busch, one of the most public-spirited citizens of St. Louis, whose benevolence and business character is universally acknowledged, and whose good name is most highly honored on both sides of the Atlantic, is a manifestation of narrow-mindedness quite unprecedented and deserving of the severest condemnation by all fair-minded citizens.
