#### AFFAIRS AT SOUTH OMAHA

Farmers Becoming Alive to Value of Stock Yards Fertilizer.

GETTING READY FOR ELECTION City Clerk Good Making Prepar

On behalf of the Farmers' congress, Secretary W. F. Delano of Lincoln and Broken Bow called at the stock yards to register a protent against the incineraof manure and fertilizing refuse by the Union Stock Yards company.

From the state university letters of about the same drift have come to Colo-**Del** El Buckingham, general manager of the company. Dean E. A. Burnett of the university deployed the loss to the farmer that will eventuate from the burning of such valuable soll fertilizer. He stated that all the refuse and manure of the yards could be used within a radius of ten miles from Omaha. Thirty miles from the Gate City, he said, the farmers along the railroads would be able to dispose of it all.

Regant W. G. Whitmore of the state university, in a letter of the same trend, asked that some further means be taken to awaken the farmer to the loss sustained in permitting the yards to burn the waste material that would enrich the soil a hundredfold.

The truth of the matter, said one of the officials, is that the farmers are willing enough to profit by the offer of the yards company to give away the manure and refuse, but the railroads have been, unable to quote a rate sufficiently low to allow the farmer to take advantage of the offer.






