BRITISH SCOUT CHIEF TALKS

Says Outdoor Activity Cures Over-Civilization and Other Ills. English Gentleman Occupies Apartment in Hotel from Which Reporters, Who Give Him Publicity, Are Excluded.

The boy scout movement is advocated as a cure for over-civilization, the evil of politics and ill of the body by Lieutenant General Sir Robert S. Baden-Powell, who addressed Omaha business men at the Commercial club at noon.

"Drug stores are driven out by the boy scout movement," he said, "because boys learn to shift for themselves. They become backwoodsmen, scouts and grow strong and healthy. Over-civilization falls before the advance of the boy scout because the spirit of manliness has been instilled in the young fellows so thoroughly that when they become men they are able to learn the manliness of the so-called civilization."

Mr. West in his address was more generous, and after asking support of the business men here, after a careful investigation, he explained some of the details of the scout movement. There are now 30,000 boys united in the movement and 15,000 men vitally interested in it.
