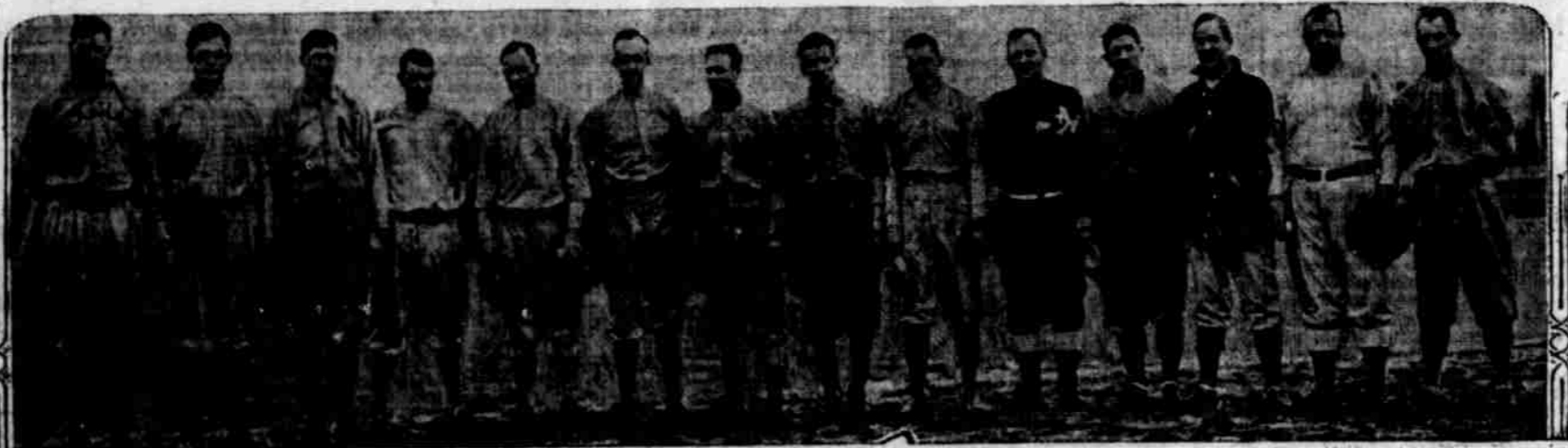
CLYDE JARNIGAN TRADED TO DES MOINES FOR THREE MEN
