

SOCIALISTS FOR BIG TRUST

Convention at York Says It Should Consist of All People.

RESOLUTIONS ARE ADOPTED

All Candidates Elected to Office Should Be Pledged to Give Part of Their Salaries to the Party.

YORK, Neb., March 2.—(Special Telegram.)—The state convention of socialists, which has been in session here for three days, adjourned this afternoon after adopting resolutions and revising the declaration of the platform on trusts.

The resolutions follow: Whereas, The fact that Victor Berger has given \$400 of his salary as national representative and Emil Seidel \$250 for educational purposes, therefore, be it resolved, That any socialist elected to office be pledged to give a percentage of their salary for the same purpose.

Resolved, That we condemn the "Boys' Scout movement," that we consider it a subterfuge of the capitalist class for inspiring the spirit of war in the youth of the land and that we look upon this movement as a kindergarten to the regular army; also, the Lawrence mill strike and the beatification of its participants, and we condemn and denounce as inhuman and diabolical the treatment they receive at the hands of capitalists.

Resolved, That the delegates to this convention sanction and approve of the open school.

State Platform Revised. The afternoon was taken up in the changing and revising of the state platform as follows: Striking out article on trust regulation, because it was felt it is no use to try to unscramble scrambled eggs. The following was substituted: Trust Regulation—We have no faith in the present plan of trust regulation.

GAGE TOWNSHIP OFFICERS FORM ROAD ASSOCIATION

BEATRICE, Neb., March 2.—(Special.)—At the good roads meeting of the township officers, held at the court house yesterday afternoon, three distinct propositions were formally endorsed by resolutions.

First, favoring a law to create a state highway commission such as Illinois has, which shall furnish plans and estimates and supervise the construction of bridges and roads wherever the people ask their services; second, an amendment of the law so that counties of the size of Gage may use the inheritance tax fund for making dirt pipe roads instead of reserving it for permanent macadamized roads; third, favoring a more uniform levy by the several townships, not to exceed \$100.
